3. Only specific bid amounts are acceptable. Please refer to the table at right for acceptable bid amounts. Bids received between acceptable increments will be raised to the next acceptable increment.
4. The minimum acceptable bid on any lot is ½ of the high estimate.
5. In the case of tie bids, the first received take precedence.
6. A value estimate follows the description of each lot. Bid higher or lower per your discretion.
7. All lots are guaranteed authentic and as described.
8. Ten day return privilege for any lot incorrectly described.
9. Payment is due upon receipt of invoice. Extended payment is allowed if bidder has made arrangements with the auctioneer in advance. However, any lots not paid for in full within 30 days after the close of the auction lose return privileges, except in the case of a dispute concerning the authenticity of an item.
10. Only our actual cost of postage and insurance will be added to each invoice. There are no additional packaging or handling fees. Most packages will be mailed via the U.S. Postal Service. Oversized packages (over one cubic foot) will be shipped FedEx Ground.

I first began collecting or at least accumulating political items when I volunteered as a teenager, too young to vote, in the downtown Louisville Goldwater for President Headquarters. It seemed that every day that I went in there were new buttons and posters available for purchase. The night of the election I got cases of Goldwater soda, enough to last me for months, in addition to posters, bumper stickers and numerous buttons. That was when I knew I was hooked as a collector of political memorabilia. By the next presidential election I was in college and working without much time for collecting. By 1972, I was married with my first child on the way so no more collecting for a while, no time, no money. The interest was always there and was reignited when I met several other collectors of political memorabilia at a show they had at a local shopping mall. In 1987 I became a single dad with three kids and traveled many miles with them, often planning our summer vacations around the APIC nationals. The first show I "set up" at was in 1986 at the Louisville Super Regional when Gene Heid let me share a half a table with him. This was the beginning of my serious collecting.

It is hard to express the joy this hobby has brought to me. I have enjoyed the travel experiences I have had visiting shows in other areas and the many friendships I have developed with people from all over the United States. This auction is not the end of my collecting but just a refocusing of my collection and the desire to simplify life a little and enjoy it with my wife.

Presently, my collecting involves selective presidential items but my main focus is on Kentucky political memorabilia, particularly Kentucky governor items, Alben Barkley and Happy Chandler. Kentuckians Zachary Taylor, Henry Clay, Abraham Lincoln, Jefferson Davis, and the Greatest of All Time Muhammad Ali are other collecting interests.

1. George Washington / Success to the United States brass token, 20 mm., in XF+ condition. Listed in DeWitt as #GW1792-3 and identified as a medalet struck to commemorate Washington's second Inauguration in 1793. **\$800-900**



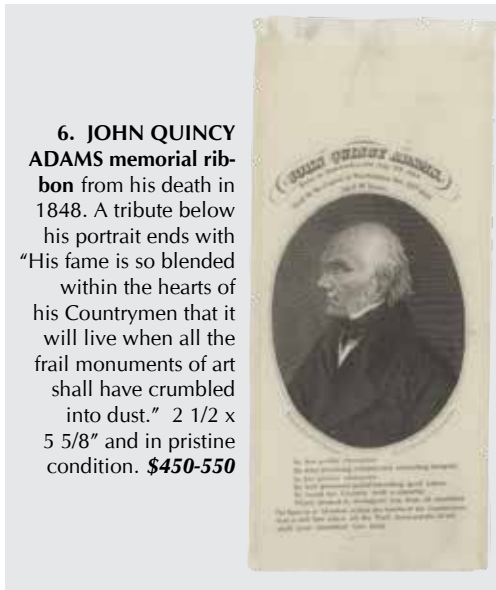
5. JOHN ADAMS President of the United States of America transferware bowl, circa 1797-1800. A portrait of Adams is featured in the center of the bowl surrounded by three figures including one woman with the scales of justice and a winged angel with a Liberty cap atop a pole. On the outside of the bowl is a portrait of "His Excellency General Washington Commander in Chief of the Forces of the United States of America & President of the Congress", as well as a portrait "Benj. Franklin Born at Boston in New England 17. Jan 1700". The perimeter is also embellished with an image of Neptune and a scene of three nude ocean nymphs and a child. The outer transfers on this rare bowl are in excellent condition with strong definition. The portion of the inside bowl that features Adams has some typical wear within the transfer, from use. This extraordinary rarity is in otherwise excellent condition, free of chips or cracks, and an exceptional display piece for a President for whom few items of any kind exist. 9 3/4" diameter and stands 4 1/4" tall. **\$6,000-7,000**



2. "GEN'L WASHINGTON" curtain tie-back in excellent condition. Desirable color variety of this early Washington piece, circa 1780's-1790's. 2" diameter and in flawless, excellent condition. **\$900-1,000**



3. GENERAL WASHINGTON brass drawer pull pair from the earliest part of the 19th century. Each measures 3 1/4" wide and both are in excellent condition, complete with 4 original brass screws. **\$1200-1300**



6. JOHN QUINCY ADAMS memorial ribbon from his death in 1848. A tribute below his portrait ends with "His fame is so blended within the hearts of his Countrymen that it will live when all the frail monuments of art shall have crumbled into dust." 2 1/2 x 5 5/8" and in pristine condition. **\$450-550**



8. GEN'L. ANDREW JACKSON / THE NATION'S GOOD brass token, 24 mm. DeWitt #AJACK 1824-4. XF+ condition with some original luster. There are a few light scratches within and above "GOOD" on the reverse. **\$100-125**



7. IN MEMORY OF DEPARTED WORTH GEN. ANDREW JACKSON. Silk ribbon memorializing President Andrew Jackson, 1845. Excellent condition, 3 x 8 1/4". **\$350-450**



9. GRATITUDE! GLORY!! PATRIOTISM!! JACKSON TICKET Early ticket from a local election hailing Andrew Jackson. "Freemen cheer the hickory tree, Its boughs in storms have sheltered thee..." Circa 1830. 2 1/4 x 4 1/2". Minor aging. **\$100-125**



4. WASHINGTON IN GLORY AMERICA IN TEARS Liverpool jug, circa 1799-1800. This classic memorial to George Washington features his portrait with birth and death dates below. Stands 9" tall. There is a tiny chip inside the spout, which is typical for these, otherwise free of other chips, cracks or imperfections. A classic early piece of American history, made in England. **\$1700-1900**



10. Lafayette textile printed to honor the Marquis de Lafayette during his American tour of 24 states in 1824. General Lafayette led troops alongside George Washington in the Revolutionary War and received a hero's welcome when he visited the U.S. some fifty years later. This larger than usual silk swatch measures 10 x 15" and, except for one stain to the right of an eagle near the center right edge, is in bright, exceptional condition. **\$350-450**

11. Martin Van Buren & Democracy medal from the 1840 campaign, white metal, 38 mm. Holed for suspension. The reverse shows the Temple of Liberty with the inscription "A Uniform & Sound Currency." DeWitt #MVB1840-2. VF condition with some typical rim nicks. **\$150-200**



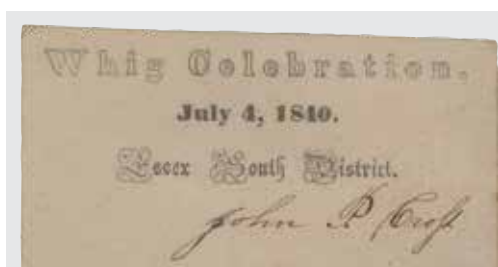
21. MAJ. GEN. W.H. HARRISON BORN FEB 9 1773 medal from the 1840 campaign in choice, uncirculated condition. 38 mm., holed for suspension. DeWitt #WHH1840-13. **\$150-200**



12. Martin Van Buren Excelsior brass clothing button. 20 mm., in bright, excellent condition, and likely issued for the 1837 Inauguration. **\$150-200**



16. HARRISON & REFORM sulphide brooch from the 1840 campaign. 1 x 1 1/8". The T-pin on the back is intact, but missing the clasp. Otherwise excellent condition. **\$650-750**



22. Whig Celebration. July 4, 1840. Ticket supporting William Henry Harrison and the Whig Party, printed on card stock and hand-signed by a "John P. Croft". Excellent condition, 1 5/8 x 3 1/4". **\$100-125**

13. Martin Van Buren SPARTAN ASSOCIATION silk ribbon, 1836-1840. A banner in the eagle's beak reads "New York must be Redeemed" and the inscription below Van Buren reads: "THE WORKING MAN - He is to Society what the main mast is to the ship". Generally excellent condition with just some light and minor discoloration to the right of the eagle. 2 1/2 x 8 1/4". **\$2,000-2,500**



17. MAJ. GEN. WM. H. HARRISON white metal token. 30 mm., holed for suspension. Grades VF-XF overall with light discoloration in the field to the right of Harrison's bust. This early token honors Harrison's military achievement on the reverse: "Resolution of Congress April 4, 1818 BATTLE OF THAMES OCT. 5. 1813" and is listed in DeWitt as #WHH1836-1. **\$150-200**



18. TIPPECANOE CLUB brass clothing button from the 1840 campaign. Maker mark "BENEDICT & BURNAM" on the reverse. 20 mm. A scarce variety in bright, choice condition. **\$125-150**



23. Battle of Tippecanoe snuff box features William Henry Harrison in his military uniform on horseback, and likely produced for the 1840 presidential campaign. 3" diameter. Still readable, but with typical crazing on the painted surface, and the imagery is somewhat hard to make out due to the gold paint and some wear. **\$400-500**



14. 1848 FREE SOIL Van Buren ribbon in choice, near mint condition. From Van Buren's campaign as the Free Soil presidential candidate in 1848. MVB is holding a scroll which reads "FREE SOIL AND FREEDOM OF THE PUBLIC LANDS BY ACTUAL SETTLERS". 2 1/4 x 6 1/4". **\$900-1,000**

19. TIPPECANOE CLUB. HARRISON. OUR COUNTRY'S HOPE. Silk ribbon from the 1840 campaign. 2 3/4 x 5 3/4" and in choice, near mint condition. **\$150-200**



20. OUR NATION MOURNS A HERO GONE Harrison silk memorial ribbon from 1841. 2 7/8 x 7 1/4" and in pristine condition. **\$125-150**

15. HARRISON & REFORM sulphide brooch from the 1840 campaign. 1 x 1 1/8" and in excellent condition with original pin. **\$900-1,100**

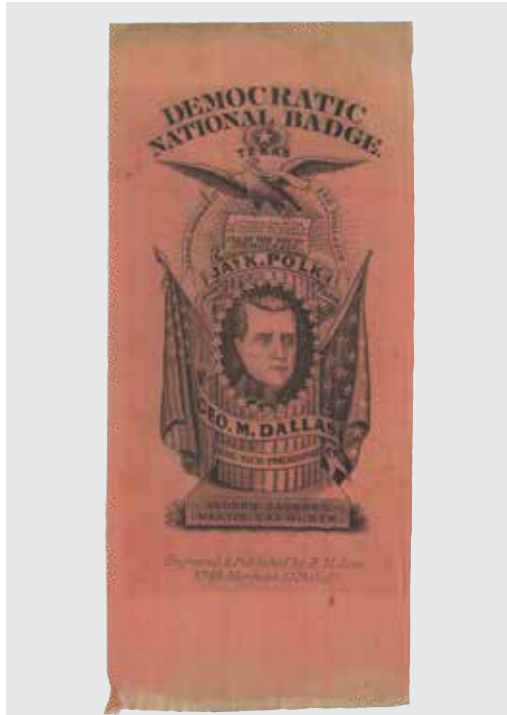


24. TIPPECANOE THAMES on flags flanking a portrait of William Henry Harrison on this rare and attractive copper luster mug from the 1840 campaign. There is a small chip on the lip of the cup above the "TIPPECANOE" flag and a slightly larger chip on the lip above the chimney. Still a very attractive display piece which retains its iridescent glow. 3 1/2" tall. **\$2,500-2,800**

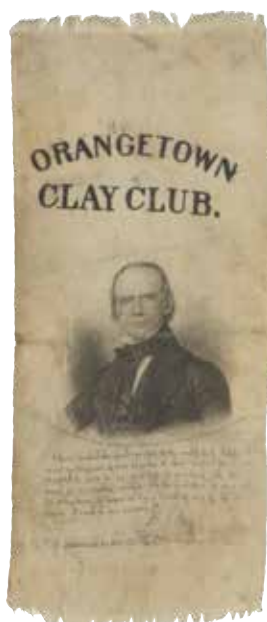




25. POLK 1844 DALLAS THE PEOPLE'S CANDIDATES
Large 45 mm. medal with facing jugate busts of Polk and Dallas from the 1844 campaign. DeWitt #JP1844-1. Reverse: "SUCCESS WILL CROWN OUR EFFORTS". Grades VF with some speckled discoloration, which is typical for early white metal. Holed for suspension. **\$350-450**



26. DEMOCRATIC NATIONAL BADGE. TEXAS... POLK...DALLAS Rare 1844 silk ribbon promoting James K. Polk for president and George M. Dallas for vice president (and honoring "Andrew Jackson" and "Martin Van Buren" on the pedestal below Polk's portrait). 3 x 7". Light and minor fading at the top and bottom edges, otherwise excellent condition. Great graphics and the desirable pink variety (more often appears in black and white). **\$1,200-1,400**



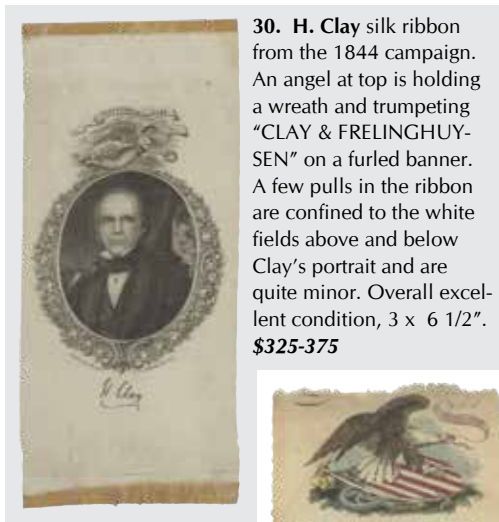
27. ORANGETOWN CLAY CLUB. Scarce silk ribbon with a rather lengthy quotation from the candidate below his portrait. Very light soiling detracts little from this scarce 3 x 7" 1844 campaign ribbon. **\$300-350**



28. HENRY CLAY. PRIDE OF AMERICA. Silk ribbon from 1844. Large 3 x 9" with some light staining to the left and below Clay's portrait, and near the eagle at top. **\$200-250**



29. HENRY CLAY 1844 beautiful medal in choice, lustrous uncirculated condition. White metal, 40 mm. DeWitt #HC1844-6. A superb example. **\$225-275**



30. H. Clay silk ribbon from the 1844 campaign. An angel at top is holding a wreath and trumpeting "CLAY & FRELINGHUYSEN" on a furled banner. A few pulls in the ribbon are confined to the white fields above and below Clay's portrait and are quite minor. Overall excellent condition, 3 x 6 1/2". **\$325-375**

31. HENRY CLAY "Mind Your Business." Silk ribbon from the 1844 campaign. 2 3/4 x 6 1/4". This has been trimmed top and bottom, but is one of the earliest ribbons to feature full color printing. **\$300-350**



32. HENRY CLAY brass shell from the 1844 campaign. Reverse: "CLAY & FRELINGHUYSEN PROTECTION & UNION". 25 mm. In choice, almost uncirculated condition and retains almost all of its original luster. **\$175-200**



33. MAJ. GENL. ZACHARY TAYLOR, THE HERO OF Fort Harrison, Palo Alto, Resaca de la Palma, Monterey, Buena Vista. This silk ribbon from the 1848 presidential campaign features Taylor in his military uniform riding a horse with the quote "A little more grape Capt. Bragg." below. 3 x 7" with some very light and minor discoloration. There's about an 80% horizontal split near the center of the ribbon. Still displays quite nicely, and extremely rare. **\$1,200-1,400**



34. MAJOR GENL. ZACH: TAYLOR medal from the 1848 campaign. Copper, 32 mm., with attractive chocolate toning in choice, almost uncirculated condition. A couple of spots near the base of Taylor's bust are minor. DeWitt #ZT1848-12. **\$225-275**



35. ZACHARY TAYLOR 1849 brass shell from the 1848 campaign, 25 mm. Reverse: "TAYLOR & FILLMORE 1849". VF condition, missing the thin loop at top. DeWitt #ZT1848-22 **\$400-450**

36. ROUGH AND READY brass clothing button from the 1848 campaign, 25 mm. Unusual variety. DeWitt #ZT1848-26. The obverse is in excellent condition and reverse shows a little corrosion, which is insignificant. **\$150-175**



39. Z. Taylor woven campaign ribbon produced for the 1848 campaign with "Swiss Silk manufacture. Z.C.B. 1848" below Taylor's bust. 4 1/4 x 5 1/2" and other than a light stain to the left of Taylor's portrait, in excellent condition. **\$450-550**



40. Zachary Taylor pill box made by the A.L. Scovill Co. in Cincinnati. Paper label on wood, 1 x 2 1/4", 5/8" thick. Scovill was an early patent medicine manufacturer. Some light discoloration on the lid, but in otherwise excellent condition and still retains about half of its pills. This appears to be a period piece, circa 1850. **\$300-400**



42. Gen. Taylor snuff box features a standing image of Zachary Taylor in full military garb, circa 1848. An unusual variety in excellent condition which would grade an 8 1/2 on a scale of 1 to 10. 3 1/4" diameter. **\$1,400-1,600**



37. GENERAL ZACHARIAH TAYLOR pewter shell shaving mirror from the 1848 campaign. The interior glass is broken, but this is in otherwise excellent condition with original brass easel and brass loop on the back. 2 5/8" diameter. **\$450-550**



43. Superb framed Taylor portrait under glass dressed in his military uniform with a brass oval border and housed in its 4 1/4 x 4 3/4" original period frame with original loop at top for hanging. If it weren't for a tiny, inconsequential paint chip on the extreme edge at 10:00, I'd describe this as pristine. **\$1,800-2,200**



38. Gen. ZACHARY TAYLOR, LATE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES. silk memorial ribbon from 1850. 2 1/4 x 7 1/2" with very light and minor discoloration. **\$300-400**

41. TAYLOR / FORGET ME NOT cosmetic box used to hold small patches to apply to ladies' cheeks. Hand painted portrait of Zachary Taylor under glass. In superb condition throughout, this fragile box still retains all of its original cardboard borders. 1 3/4 x 2 3/4", 1/2" thick. **\$1,800-2,200**



44. ROUGH AND READY MAJr. GENERAL ZACHARY TAYLOR paper fan from the 1848 campaign. Features a portrait of Taylor in uniform flanked by battle scenes. Typical tears in the folds of the fan, none of which are greater than 2 1/2". Displays quite nicely and deserves to be properly framed. Measures about 9 1/2 x 13" as shown. **\$1,200-1,400**





45. TAYLOR clock circa 1848, made in France, features General Taylor in military garb atop his horse Whitey. Much of the clock mechanism in the back is missing, as well as the clock hands and crystal. Still a terrific, beautifully cast brass display piece on its original 3 3/4 x 6 1/4" wooden pedestal. A similar example in excellent condition, complete with its original glass dome, fetched \$21,500 in a Heritage Auction Galleries sale in May of 2012. **\$3,500-4,500**



46. ROUGH AND READY STROP housed in its original cardboard sheath and made by the W. Hutchings Co. in Cambridgeport, Massachusetts. 11 x 1 1/4 x 1 1/4". The strop shows wear from use, as does the cardboard covering. There are several chips on the paper label, and a 1 1/4 x 1 1/2" section of cardboard has broken off one of the sides, not affecting any text or graphics. A unique Taylor-related item, circa 1847-1850. **\$250-300**



47. Franklin Pierce reverse on glass hand painted portrait enclosed in a brass oval border and set in a mother of pearl frame. Poor condition - note the cracks in the glass and two less obtrusive diagonal cracks on the left and right edges of the frame. 2 1/8 x 3 1/4". **\$500-600**

48. BUCHANAN AND BRECKINRIDGE silk ribbon, 1856. Generally excellent condition with just a hint of very minor discoloration, easily grades an 8 1/2 +. 1 7/8 x 6". **\$550-650**



49. BUCHANAN & BRECKINRIDGE silk ribbon from the 1856 campaign. Among the more graphic Buchanan ribbons with an American flag at top and printed in red, white and blue. 2 1/2 x 7 3/4". There is very minor overall soiling, a stain upper left corner, and some damage near the bottom 1 3/4" which has been secured by a section of fabric on the back, to avoid further deterioration. **\$300-400**



50. JOHN C. FREMONT / HONOR TO WHOM HONOR IS DUE large 43 mm. copper medal from the 1856 campaign in choice, uncirculated condition. DeWitt #JC1856-2. The reverse depicts three men surveying land with a range of mountains in the distance and the U.S. Capitol Building on the summit. Beautiful chocolate-brown tone. **\$350-450**



51. JOHN C. FREMONT medal with his standard 1856 campaign slogan on the reverse. White metal, 35 mm. DeWitt #JC1856-4. In choice, almost uncirculated condition and retains most of its original luster. **\$175-200**

52. FREMONT & DAYTON PATHFINDER uncut pair of silk ribbons with Fremont's 1856 campaign slogan below. Excellent condition and measures 2 3/8 x 10". **\$250-300**



53. JOHN C. FREMONT. Hail! to the Chief who in triumph advances. Silk ribbon, 1856. Unusual variety, 2 x 4 3/8". A light spot on the left and another above the "O" in "FREMONT" detract little. **\$250-300**

54. Crossing the Rocky Mountains satirical carte de visite depicts John C. Fremont pointing to the West in his military uniform atop a rocking horse. Excellent condition, blank back, 2 3/8 x 4". **\$150-200**



55. REPUBLICAN NOMINATIONS. "Free Speech Free Press Free Kansas Fremont" electoral ballot from Ohio promoting John C. Fremont for president and William L. Dayton for vice president, 1856. Nice graphics on yellow paper and measures a large 4 x 9 1/2". There's some minor soiling at the bottom 1 1/2" and a diagonal crease bottom right. This desirable ticket has a bold presence, and the imperfections are minor. **\$150-200**

56. JOHN C. FREMONT. REPUBLICAN CANDIDATE FOR FIFTEENTH PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES

Currier print from 1856. There is some minor paper loss, mostly near the top left, some moderate staining, mostly confined to the top and bottom edges above and below Fremont's portrait, and a 1 3/8" tear along the left edge not affecting the portrait. 12 x 15". **\$125-175**

62. ABRAHAM LINCOLN / HANNIBAL HAMLIN "doughnut" ferrotypes. This medium-size example is 30 mm. diameter. The Lincoln side shows some "rubbing" on and to the right of Lincoln's ear, and two light horizontal scratches within his face. The Hamlin side is in excellent, flawless condition. **\$650-750**

63. FOR PRESIDENT 1864

A. LINCOLN single-sided ferrotypes with original pin and clasp on the back. There's a light vertical line to the right of Lincoln that appears to have been a manufacturing imperfection. Overall grades an 8 on a scale of 1 to 10. **\$600-700**



64. A. LINCOLN ferrotypes from the 1864 campaign with original stickpin and clasp on reverse. 20 mm. Minor discoloration on the tintype and grades a 7 1/2 on a scale of 1 to 10. **\$450-550**

68. Lincoln cardboard albumen photo in a brass gem-size (3/4 x 1") frame. Minor soiling, this grades a 7 1/2+ on a scale of 1 to 10. **\$200-300**

70. Lincoln and Grant back to back albumen photos in this brass Civil War locket. Circa 1863 (even though Lincoln is beardless). 1 5/16 x 9/16" as shown. The clasp is gone, but this is in otherwise choice condition with original loop for suspension. **\$350-450**



71. FOR PRESIDENT ABRAHAM LINCOLN OF ILLINOIS large 38 mm. medal struck in brass. VF+ condition. DeWitt #AL1860-18. Quite desirable and among the largest Lincoln campaign medals. **\$250-300**

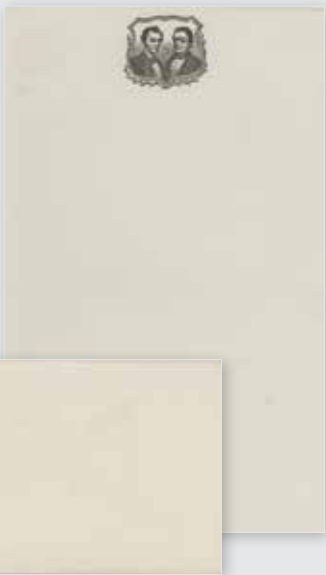

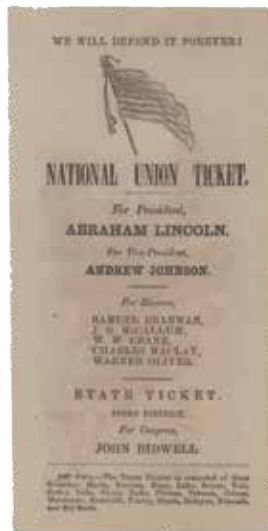

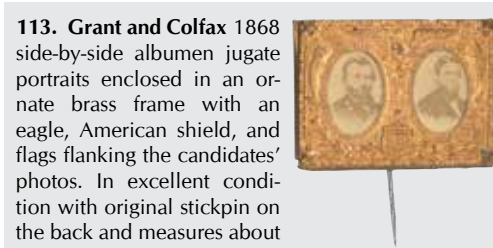

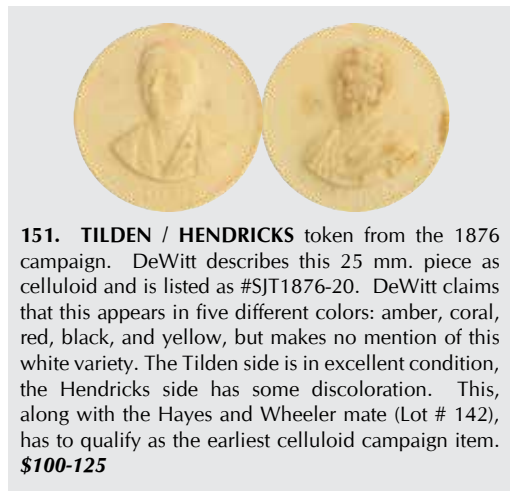

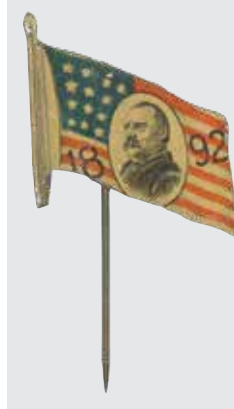

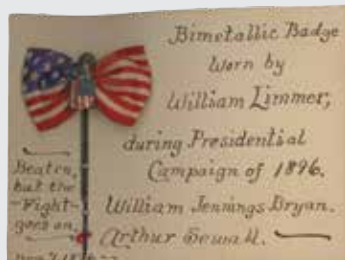

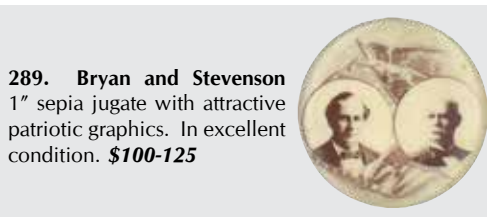

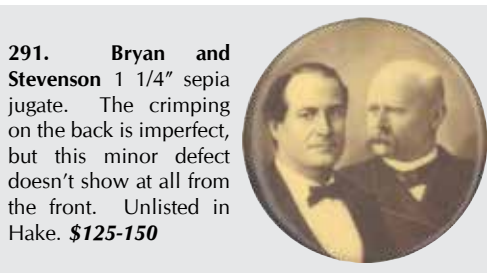

A legal fight then developed between Taylor and Beckham over the governorship, and Beckham ultimately prevailed. This pinback is from a special 1900 election in which Beckham defeated Yerkes (you'll find a McKinley-TR-Yerkes elsewhere in this catalog), the only year in which a Kentucky governor's race coincided with a presidential campaign. 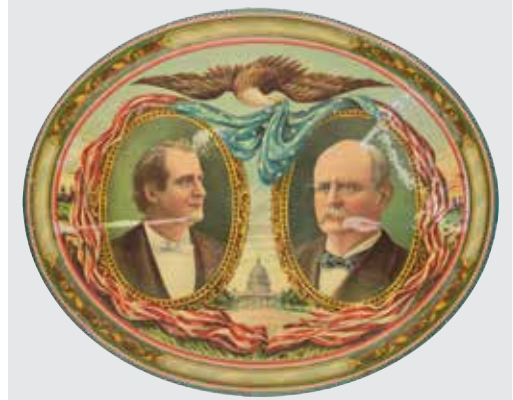

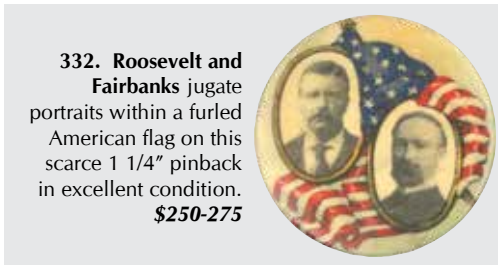

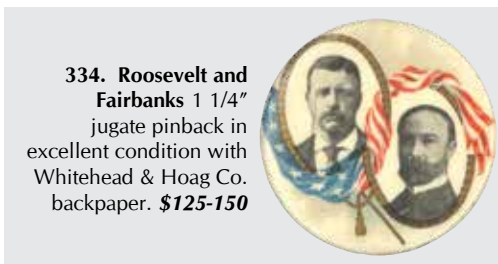

Before the Spanish-American War, the 10th Cavalry served in combat during the Indian Wars in the West. Although TR was the popular focus of the "Charge up San Juan Hill", black newspapers and magazines (and also many predominantly white mainstream periodicals) recounted the activities of these black soldiers. Poetry, dramas, and songs all celebrated their service and valor, and many Negro homes had prints of the famous charge of the colored troops up San Juan Hill. This pinback is in excellent condition with its original Geraghty Mfg. Co. Chicago backpaper (and a disclaimer on the curl: **COPYRIGHT 1903 BY J.J. GERAGHTY**) and has absolutely everything going for it: rarity, condition, content and graphics. It has the distinction of rivaling or surpassing the value of a Cox-Roosevelt jugate. There are only three examples known - one is in the Steve & Gary Cohen collection, one changed hands for \$24,500 at the 2012 APIC National Convention in Columbus - and this one, which turned up on eBay late last year. **\$18,000-22,000**

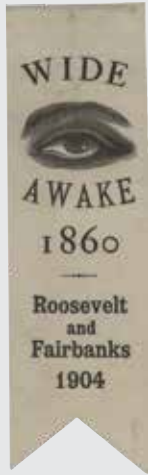

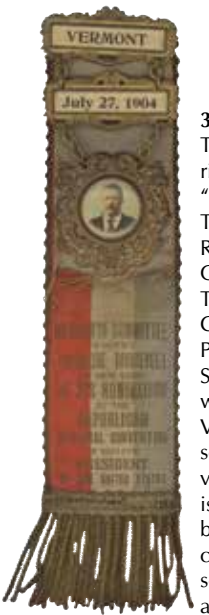

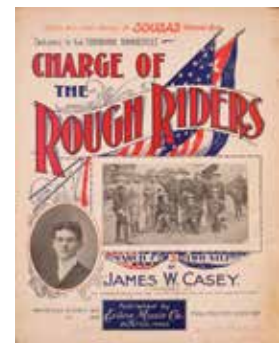

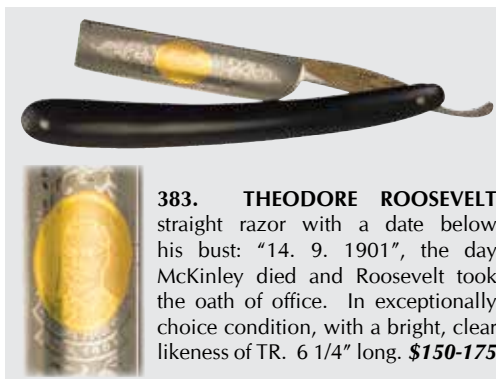

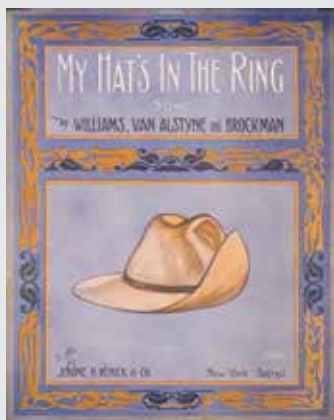

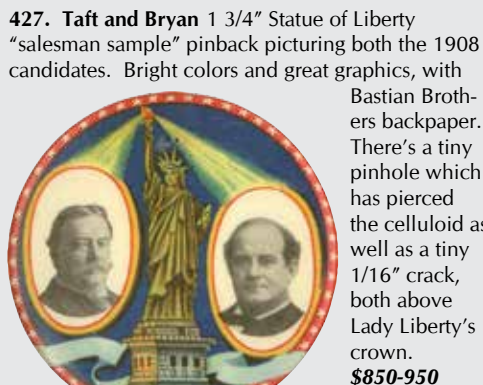

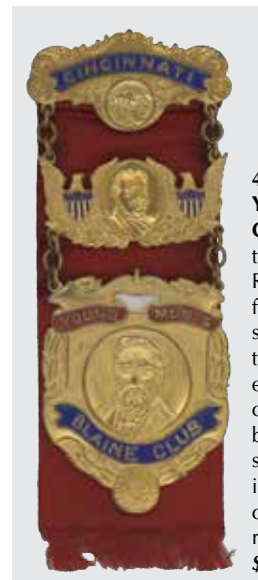

Things got a little tense when 20th Century Fox President Spyros Skouras - an ardent anticommunist - recalled Khrushchev's famous statement that Russia would "bury" capitalism. The Premier's infamous anger really exploded when he learned that he wouldn't be allowed to visit Disneyland, as US government authorities feared that the crowds might pose a safety hazard. Khrushchev was fuming and retorted: "I would very much like to see Disneyland. But they say we cannot guarantee your security. Then what must I do? Commit suicide? Is there an epidemic of cholera there or something? Or have gangsters taken hold of the place that can destroy me?" Thankfully, the Premier left the country the following morning without further incident. This rare button reflects a surreal slice of a moment in the history of the Cold War, and has only been offered a handful of times. Excellent condition. **\$800-1,000**

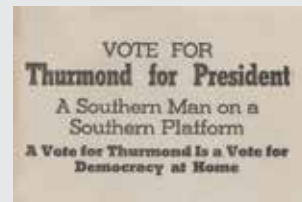

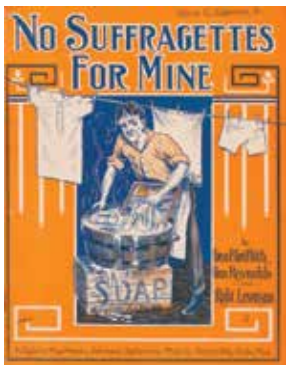

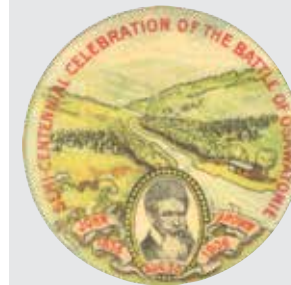
