Please read our simple rules:

- There are several ways to bid.** You can bid using the enclosed bid sheet (mail, fax or email), you may phone in your bids, or you can bid online at USAmericanaAuctions.com. Mail, fax, and email bids *must* be received by midnight, PST, on January 19th, 2015.
- Lots close individually.** Any lot that has no bids or one bid will close at 7pm PST, Wednesday, January 21st. All other lots will be put on a 30-minute clock beginning at 7pm. Once a lot goes 30 minutes without a bid, that lot will close. If a bid is placed on any lot during its 30-minute period, the clock on that lot will reset to 30 minutes. Only higher competing bids will reset the clock, a currently high bidder upping their max bid on a lot will not.
- Phone and online bids accepted while the lot is open. The current high bid will be revealed and you may increase that bid to the next acceptable increment.
- Only specific bid amounts are acceptable. Please refer to the table at right for acceptable bid amounts. Bids received between acceptable increments will be raised to the next acceptable increment.
- The minimum acceptable bid on any lot is ½ of the high estimate.
- You can request a call back on items which have a current high bid of \$500+.
- In the case of tie bids, the first received take precedence.
- A value estimate follows the description of each lot. Bid higher or lower per your discretion.
- All lots are guaranteed authentic and as described.
- Ten day return privilege for any lot incorrectly described.
- Payment is due upon receipt of invoice. Extended payment is allowed if bidder has made arrangements with the auctioneer in advance. However, any lots not paid for in full within 30 days after the close of the auction lose return privileges, except in the case of a dispute concerning the authenticity of an item.
- Only our actual cost of postage and insurance will be added to each invoice. There are no additional packaging or handling fees. Most packages will be shipped via the U.S. Postal Service. Some larger packages may be shipped via FedEx Ground.
- Buyer's fee of 15% will be added to the winning price of each lot.**
- California residents will be charged 8.25% sales tax unless valid California resale information is provided. Resale forms sent upon request.

***Cathy and Tom Berg***

These are the memories of my best friend, Tom Berg, who we lost on July 4th, 2014. He would miss his greatest achievement in his collecting career, the production of the magnificent 2014 A.P.I.C. Denver National Convention.

Tom was the consummate political collector who specialized in William Jennings Bryan items, coattails, Colorado locals and advertising, as well as John W. Davis items, and early ferrotypes. He was an excellent Harvard-educated conservation attorney who saved a number of Colorado Springs mountainsides from land developers. He was also a dedicated distance runner who was a manager of Colorado Springs and Pikes Peak road races.

My first recollection of meeting Tom was at the 1987 Louisville A.P.I.C. National Convention where he demonstrated great personal sacrifice in assisting stroke victim and fellow Colorado collector Mac McGraw during the show.

Later Tom and I attended the first Reno Regional Show. We would eventually have a great time, but we arrived late in the evening and were assigned a room in the back of the hotel with only a double bed. Tom was ready for a different room after a night of sharing a bed with me and my snoring.

In 1996 I took my high school track and field team to Colorado Springs for a meet in what was supposed to be balmy weather. Tom braved the miserable 39 degree weather with biting snow during the lunch break to show me some new Colorado political items he had just purchased. He didn't permit bad weather to slow his interest in collecting political items.

We attended many political button shows together and he always insisted in his morning run before anyone else was awake. At many of the shows he and I would room hop while Cathy sold our pinbacks much better than we could.

He adopted the vegan lifestyle which had its complications in finding vegan food on the road. Tom and his lovely wife Cathy visited my lovely wife Karen and I in Norman on their travels to the West Palm Beach Show to publicize the Denver National. Karen and I took Cathy and Tom to a newly opened vegan restaurant in Oklahoma City. Tom had a wonderful time but Cathy was not impressed because she was not a vegan. The next year 2014 he would set an A.P.I.C. record for the consumption of kale at a West Palm Beach restaurant.

Tom was a great friend to many people in a number of avocations from political items collectors to Colorado Springs distance runners, and conservation attorneys. He had a tremendous outgoing personality that few acquaintances could resist. His attention to detail contributed greatly to the success of the Denver National Convention along with the work of Martha and Ron Puechner. His Memorial at the Denver National Convention demonstrated that he will be sorely missed.

**1. PEOPLE'S CHOICE** John Quincy Adams sewing box from 1828. About 4 x 4 x 4" with a portrait of Adams under glass on the inside top lid. Plush fabric with stenciled letters and an 8-petal flower adorn the top lid. Still retains its bright colors. One of the cardboard flaps under the top lid is gone and there are some glue remnants on the top of one of the four main cardboard panels, but this is in otherwise excellent condition. A terrific display piece and an example of a very early, true campaign item. **\$3,000-3,500**

**2. William Henry Harrison 1840 campaign brooch** features the standard log cabin and hard cider barrel motif. 1 x 1 1/8" with original t-pin on the reverse. Some light craze cracks and minor chips in the paint, but a scarce variety that still retains its bright colors. **\$550-650**



**3. Large 4 1/2" diameter Zachary Taylor pewter mirror** in bright, excellent condition. Embossed bust of Taylor on the obverse and "B.C. BREVETE A PARIS" on the reverse. Imported from France for use in the 1848 campaign. The loop and easel are gone, which is often the case. This should command a premium in this unusually large size, as these typically appear in the smaller 3 1/2" diameter size. **\$400-500**



**4. Z. TAYLOR M. FILLMORE GRAND NATIONAL WHIG BANNER** N. Currier print from the 1848 campaign. "THE PEOPLE'S CHOICE FOR PRESIDENT & VICE PRESIDENT FROM 1849 TO 1853." In excellent condition, but has been trimmed, not affecting any text or graphics. The print itself measures 9 1/4 x 12 3/4" and has been mounted to 10 1/2 x 14" cardstock. **\$450-550**



**6. Pierce & King GRAND NATIONAL DEMOCRATIC BANNER** from the 1852 campaign by N. Currier. 10 x 14" with a 1 1/4" tear along the top edge and a scuff on the curtain to the left of Pierce's portrait. Light toning along the perimeter. This appears to have had a very light clear varnish applied to the surface at one time, but that application does not detract from the displayability of this scarce print. **\$400-500**



**7. Scott & Graham GRAND NATIONAL WHIG BANNER** from the 1852 campaign, by N. Currier. 12 x 14". Toning is evident along the perimeter, and above the center of the eagle. Desirable display piece for a very tough candidate that deserves to be framed. **\$450-550**

**5. LEWIS CASS 1849 / CASS & BUTLER 1849** 24 mm. shell with original loop. Grades very fine overall with a little rust on the reverse from 7:00-8:00. A very rare 1848 campaign piece from a very tough candidate. **\$850-950**



**8. GENERAL WINDFIELD (sic) SCOTT alphabet plate.** 6" diameter, in excellent condition. **\$200-250**





**9. Buchanan & Breckenridge (sic) GRAND NATIONAL DEMOCRATIC BANNER** from the 1856 campaign, by N. Currier. 10 x 13 3/4", with light toning around the perimeter. **\$550-650**



**10. Fillmore & Donelson GRAND NATIONAL AMERICAN BANNER** from the 1856 campaign, by N. Currier. Bright colors and wide margins, this measures 12 1/4 x 16 1/4". Very light foxing in the margins. There is a horizontal crease through the center. An attractive print that deserves to be matted and framed. **\$750-850**

**11. FREMONT ferrotype** enclosed in a decorative brass clothing button with original shank on back. 16 mm. and in pristine condition - the portrait still retains its glossy surface sheen. About as close to a "10" as you'll ever find! **\$800-900**



**12. LINCOLN AND HAMLIN** side by side jugate portraits enclosed in a beaded brass bezel. 21 mm. The photos are crisp and sharp, but there's a tiny dig on Lincoln's chin and another between the portraits. The original stickpin on the back has been replaced and resoldered. Still, a nice example that grades an 8+. **\$1,200-1,400**



**013. The rail splitter HONEST ABE** brass figural ax from the 1860 campaign. 1 7/16" wide. Missing the t-pin on the back but in otherwise excellent condition and an iconic, desirable campaign item that has fetched as much as \$6,000 in excellent condition. **\$2,400-2,800**



**14. ABRAHAM LINCOLN 1860 / HANNIBAL HAMLIN 1860** ferrotype in excellent, flawless condition with a lustrous brass border. 24 mm. diameter. **\$850-950**



**15. FOR PRESIDENT ABRAHAM LINCOLN / FOR VICE PRESIDENT ANDREW JOHNSON** ferrotype made by John Galt, who also produced the encased postage of the period. This distinctive design shows Lincoln within an hourglass-style brass enclosure. Photos of both candidates are sharp and crisp, and this classy and desirable 25 mm. ferro is in excellent, flawless condition. **\$3,500-4,000**



**16. FOR PRESIDENT 1864 A. LINCOLN.** ferrotype with original pin on the reverse. 24 mm. Missing the clasp on the back, but this in otherwise excellent, flawless condition. **\$700-800**

**17. ABRAHAM LINCOLN 1864** 18 mm. dated ferrotype set in a brass bezel with a filled tin back (no pin, as made). Distinctive portrait of Lincoln flanked by four stars. The tiny black specks along the right side appear to have occurred during the manufacture of the tintage, and detract minimally. **\$1,000-1,250**



**18. UNION & LAWS LINCOLN / JOHNSON** ferrotype from the 1864 campaign. 22 mm. The Lincoln photo is just a bit fuzzy and has some very minor imperfections to the left of the portrait. The Johnson photo is sharp, but there's a small crescent-shaped clip at 12:00 (as made), and some very minor chipping around the perimeter. All in all, we would grade this an 8+. **\$700-800**



**19. A. LINCOLN ferrotype** in the large 34 mm. diameter (1 5/16") size. The pin on the back is missing and the tintage is a bit off-center, as made, but this impressive ferro is in otherwise excellent condition with traces of the original silvering on the brass bezel still intact. **\$900-1,100**



**20. A. LINCOLN** 17 mm. ferrotype. The stickpin on the reverse is missing, but this is in otherwise excellent condition and deserves a grade of 8 1/2 - 9. **\$450-550**



**21. 22 mm. Lincoln ferrotype** from the 1864 campaign in bright, excellent condition. The stickpin on the reverse is missing. If it weren't for a tiny black imperfection to the left of Lincoln (which occurred during the manufacture of the tintage), this bright and pleasing example would grade a 9 1/2. **\$600-700**



**22. Large, impressive 1 1/2 x 1 7/8" Lincoln tintage** with thin brass decorative frame. A showy piece in generally excellent condition with very minor surface imperfections which can only be seen at an angle. **\$800-900**



**23. The Defenders of Our Union** poster printed by Kimmel & Forster, New York. 19 x 23 1/2" and in generally excellent condition with trivial toning bottom corners and a tiny paper chip top right corner. Features George Washington along with significant Civil War admirals and generals, but of more importance to political collectors is that this pictures Lincoln AND Johnson and, as such, is quite desirable. This is either an 1864 campaign poster, or a poster issued in early 1865 as a post-election (or perhaps Inaugural) piece. **\$500-600**



**24. Tintype with Lincoln poster** in a print shop, circa 1862-1864. Wonderful scene of print shop facilities and workers, with large Lincoln poster featured prominently in the background. It's our guess that this is the very print house that produced the depicted poster.



Tintype set in a decorative brass border, both of which are covered in glass and set within an additional decorative brass frame. Measures 4 1/4 x 3 1/4" overall. Excellent condition throughout. **\$600-800+**



**32. JOHN BELL / EDWARD EVERETT** 1860 campaign ferrotypes with plush green fabric border, 24 mm. The Bell tintype has some light surface crazing which can only be seen at an angle. The Everett tintype is in flawless, excellent condition and grades a 10. Both sides have their original glossy sheen, and the fabric is bright and in excellent condition with original string loop for suspension. **\$300-400**

**25. FOR LINCOLN.** top hat with a thin, silk hat band. These became popular during the 1864 campaign. The hat band measures 2" by about 24" and is in remarkably excellent condition. The original paper interior tag is intact and reads F.W. ROBERTS HATTER & FURRIER DOVER, N.H. with a hand-written hat size of "6 1/8". The top hat exhibits typical aging and some damage from having been crushed, but it retains its shape, its romance, and its character. A terrific, iconic Lincoln display piece. **\$850-950**



**28. STEPHEN A. DOUGLAS POPULAR SOVEREIGNTY / HERSCHEL V. JOHNSON NON-INTERVENTION** 1860 ferrotypes in the larger 28 mm. size. The Douglas side has some light crazing and grades an 8. The Johnson side is in excellent condition and grades a 9. Bright, lustrous brass rim. **\$400-450**



**33. JOHN BELL. / EDWARD EVERETT.** 24 mm. ferrotypes from the 1860 campaign. Plush fabric border with original string for suspension. Both sides are in excellent condition and grade a 9. **\$300-400**



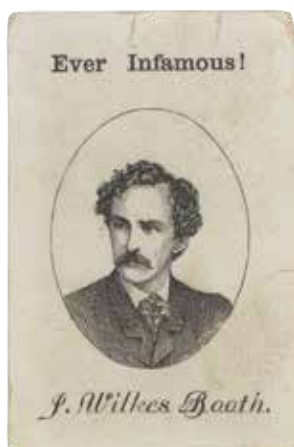
**26. UNION STANDARD BEARERS, for 1864** Lincoln & Johnson campaign envelope with jugate images flanked by American flags. There are two rolled-up scrolls which read "AMNESTY" and "EMANCIPATION". 3 x 5 1/2", in excellent condition. **\$175-200**



**29. STEPHEN A. DOUGLAS 1860 / HERSCHEL V. JOHNSON 1860** 25 mm. ferrotypes. The Douglas tintype is in excellent condition and grades a 9. The Johnson tintype exhibits some minor bubbling which can only be seen at an angle and grades a 7 1/2 - 8. Minor toning on the brass rim. **\$325-375**



**30. STEPHEN A. DOUGLAS 1860 / HERSCHEL V. JOHNSON 1860** 24 mm. ferrotypes. Both tintypes are in flawless, excellent condition and grade a 9+. There's a trivial indentation on the reverse along the rim at 9:00. **\$400-500**



**27. Ever Infamous! J. Wilkes Booth.** carte de visite, circa 1865. 2 1/4 x 3 1/2". An unusual CDV with scattered creases and minor aging. **\$100-150**



**31. STEPHEN A. DOUGLAS / HERSCHEL V. JOHNSON** unusual 23 mm. ferrotypes from the 1860 campaign with a green composition gutta percha-like encasement. Both tintypes are in flawless, excellent condition and grade a 9+. There's a tiny chip just above where this piece is holed for suspension. **\$300-400**



**34. John Bell figural torch** from the 1860 campaign. An early torch with hand-forged iron brackets and a white metal (pewter?) bell. About 24" long overall. There's a split in the wooden handle where it meets the metal, and some rust on the brackets, but this is in otherwise good condition with expected aging. The only other reference we could find related to a John Bell figural campaign torch was from one of Tom Slater's offerings in the 1980's, which described an amber glass bell with typical metal fittings. There also exists a four-sided glass lantern with Bell's name on two sides and the image of a bell on the other two. Intact, complete, and a remarkable rarity. **\$2,000+**





**35. J.C. BRECKINRIDGE / JOSEPH LANE** "donut" style ferrotype from the 1860 campaign. Nice medium-sized 30 mm. diameter, both sides of this ferro are in excellent condition and retain their glossy surface sheen. Easily grades a 9. **\$1,400-1,600**



**36. J.C. BRECKINRIDGE / JOSEPH LANE** "donut" style 24 mm. ferrotype. Minor bubbling on the Breckinridge side when held at an angle, otherwise excellent. Some original silvering is still evident. **\$700-800**



**37. JOHN C. BRECKINRIDGE 1860 / JOSEPH LANE 1860** ferrotype, 24 mm. The Breckinridge side is in pristine, flawless condition and grades a 10. The Lane is in generally excellent condition with just a little minor "waviness" on the surface of the tintype which is confined to the perimeter. Overall a choice example with a lustrous brass rim. **\$800-900**

**38. BRECKINRIDGE LANE / 1860** diminutive 16 mm. ferrotype. The Breckinridge side is in excellent condition and rates an 8 - 8 1/2. The Lane side is a little dark with some minor surface imperfections. **\$275-375**



**39. FOR PRESIDENT JOHN C. BRECKINRIDGE OF KENTUCKY** large 38 mm. medal struck in white metal for the 1860 campaign. Listed in Dewitt as #JCB1860-1. In choice, lustrous, almost uncirculated condition, this is the largest - and the most desirable - Breckinridge campaign medal. **\$375-475**



**40. 1862 McClellan brass shell** shield-shaped badge. An oval tintype portrait of McClellan is surrounded by a Bible, scroll, seated Liberty, crossed swords, and the scales of justice. Within the extreme perimeter, in tiny raised letters, are his Civil War military exploits. 1 1/4 x 1 1/4" overall. An intricate, showy badge that really catches your eye. The tintype itself grades an 8 1/2 +, the brass shell is in excellent, lustrous condition. The t-pin on the back is missing. **\$2,000-2,500**



**41. THE CONSTITUTION AS IT IS 1864** M'CLELLAN campaign ferrotype, 22 mm. Both sides are in choice, lustrous, near mint condition, and this easily grades a 9 1/2. Unusual McClellan/McClellan variety, and listed in Dewitt as such (GMCC 1864-54). Dewitt also lists this as a McClellan/Pendleton variety, so we can assume that they were intentionally made in both varieties. **\$500-600**



**42. M'CLELLAN** tintype set in a 27 mm. gutta percha encasement. The tintype is in excellent, flawless condition. There are a couple of chips around the outer edge of the gutta percha, and a diagonal stress crack. A hole in the back suggests this was intended to be used as a clothing button. **\$275-375**

**43. George McClellan** tintype housed in a brass gem-sized 3/4 x 1" frame. Minor surface crazing. Tiny holes at the top and bottom of the thin brass frame not affecting the tintype. **\$250-350**



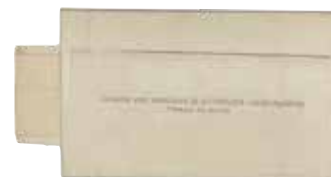
**44. McClellan ceramic pipe** About 2 3/4" tall and 3" wide, and an extremely well executed likeness of the 1864 Democratic presidential candidate. Two trivial chips below McClellan's collar are minor and confined to one side of the pipe, which is in otherwise excellent condition. **\$300-400**



**45. JEFF DAVIS metamorphic card** from 1863. A smug, smiling Jefferson Davis "after the surrender of FORT SUMTER April 13 1861" becomes wide-eyed and frowning when the tab is pulled down, revealing "JEFF DAVIS. after the surrender of VICKSBURG July 4 1863". Apparently intended to be mailed, with the wording "Postage 3 cents" on the tab. About 2 3/4 x 5 3/4" overall. A terrific, historical, fragile memento from the latter days of the Civil War, in excellent condition. **\$400-500**



**46. JEFF DAVIS metamorphic card.** Similar to the preceding lot, but with a different inscription: a smiling "JEFF DAVIS AFTER THE FALL OF FORT SUMTER 1861" becomes a frowning "JEFF DAVIS AFTER THE FALL OF FORT SUMTER 1863". **\$400-500**



**47. U.S. SENATE Impeachment OF THE President** admission ticket dated April 13th, 1868, to attend the Impeachment proceedings of President Andrew Johnson. About 3 x 3 1/2" and in excellent condition. **\$300-400**

**48. BURIAL OF THADDEUS STEVENS** silk ribbon dated August 17th, 1868, and distributed by the UNION LEAGUE OF PHILADELPHIA. A member of the House of Representatives from Pennsylvania, Stevens made his mark in U.S. history as a fierce opponent of slavery and discrimination against African-Americans, and continued to fight to secure the



rights of Black Americans during Reconstruction, often in opposition to President Andrew Johnson. Stevens was still serving in Congress at the time of his death on August 11, 1868. Steven's body was conveyed by white and African-American pallbearers from his house to the Capitol Rotunda in Washington, D.C. Thousands of mourners of both races filed past his casket as he lay in state. His body was then taken by funeral train to Lancaster, Pennsylvania. First time we've ever seen this rare, historic ribbon, worn by a mourner who witnessed the burial. 2 3/8 x 6 1/2" and in excellent condition with pencil notations. **\$450-550**



**51. Grant & Colfax** side by side jugate ferrotypic lapel stud from the 1868 campaign. 23 mm. The purple paper border is a bit faded but this is in otherwise excellent condition. The tintype is in flawless condition and grades a 9. **\$425-475**

**52. GRANT COLFAX** attractive jugate ferrotypic complete with original pin on reverse. 1 3/16" wide. There's a trivial imperfection above "ANT" in "GRANT", but this attractive pin is in otherwise choice, near mint condition. **\$550-650**



**53. Gen. U.S. GRANT SCHUYLER COLFAX** "porthole" jugate. Tintype portraits are enclosed in a thin, fragile 23 mm. brass shell, which is crimped around a tin backing. The pin on the reverse is gone. Aside from some minor surface wear along the right edge, this is in excellent condition, and the tintype is flawless and near mint. **\$400-500**



**54. Ulysses S. Grant** 20 mm. diameter ferrotypic. The pin on the reverse is gone, and there's light overall crazing on the tintype. **\$100-150**



**55. GRANT oval tintype** set in a decorative tin bezel, suspended from a tin eagle stickpin. About 1 1/2 x 2 1/8" overall and in flawless, excellent condition, with some of the tin silvering still intact. Attractive and showy. **\$575-675**

**56. U.S. GRANT** tintype surrounded by a brass ring and set in a gutta percha pin. 1" diameter. There's a very tiny divot in the tintype near the edge at 7:00 and a stress crack in the gutta percha at 5:00. **\$150-200**



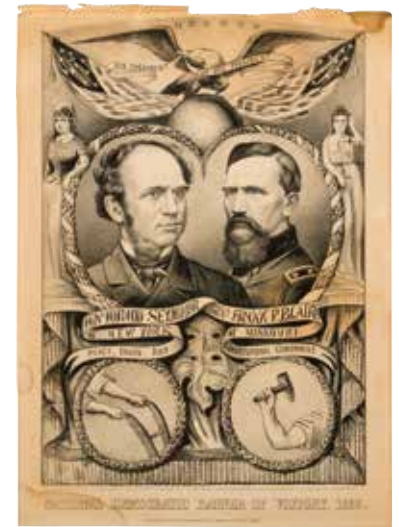
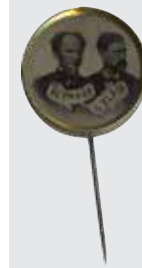
**57. 1872 Gen. U.S. GRANT** ferrotypic pin. Tintype of Grant enclosed within a brass shell scroll with the date "1872" above and four stars below. 1 x 1 1/4", with original pin on the reverse. In bright, beautiful, pristine condition - about as close to a "10" as you'll ever see! **\$700-800**



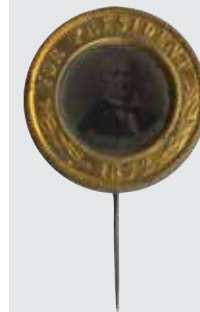
**58. SEYMOUR BLAIR** jugate ferrotypic from 1868. 1 3/16" wide. There's a minor divot just to the right of Blair's photo, but this is in otherwise excellent condition with the original pin on the reverse, and retains its original, glossy sheen on the surface of the tintype. **\$450-550**

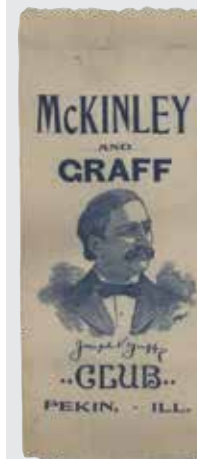

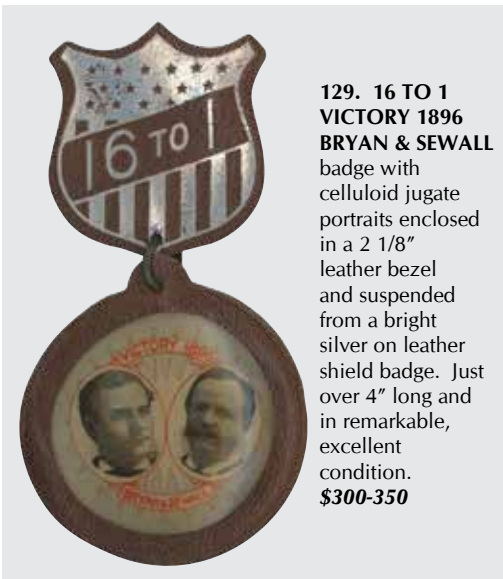

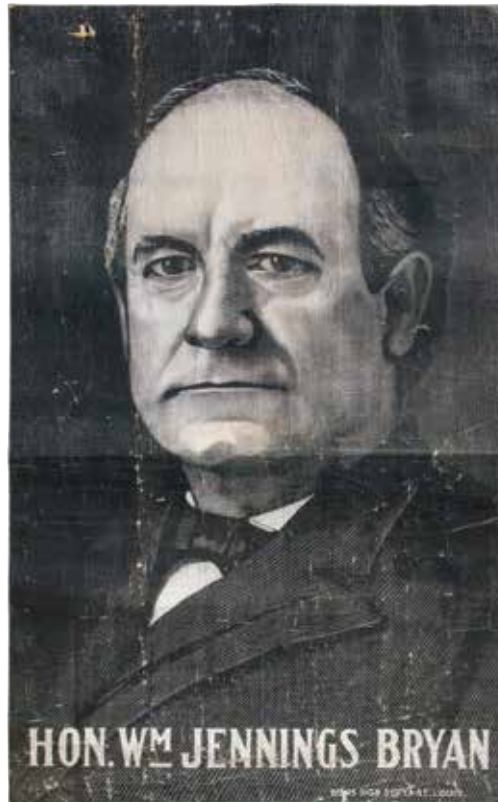

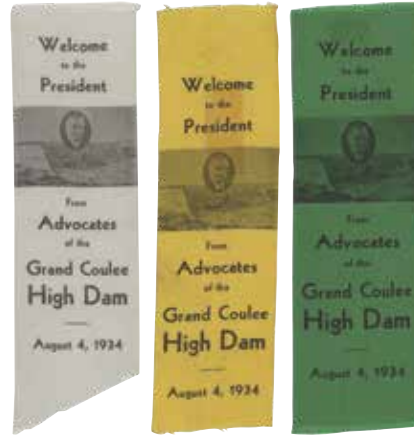
